The Warren & Saline River R.R. has asked the Cormission to approve its acquisition and operation of part of the line of the Warren & Onachita Valley Railway, a wholly owned subsidiary of the Rock Island. The ALOV concurrently has filed an application to abandon its entire line. The Wall runs from Warren to Cloquet. The WeSR has also asked approval for acquisition of trackage rights from the LOP RR. These trackage rights at Warren will connect the WaSR with the acquired segment of the W&OV. The W&SR is owned outright by the Potlatch Corporation and the WESR will purchase the MP's interest in the jointly owned trackage at Warren for \$5,343.75. 林本本の、古の古の 本本本
